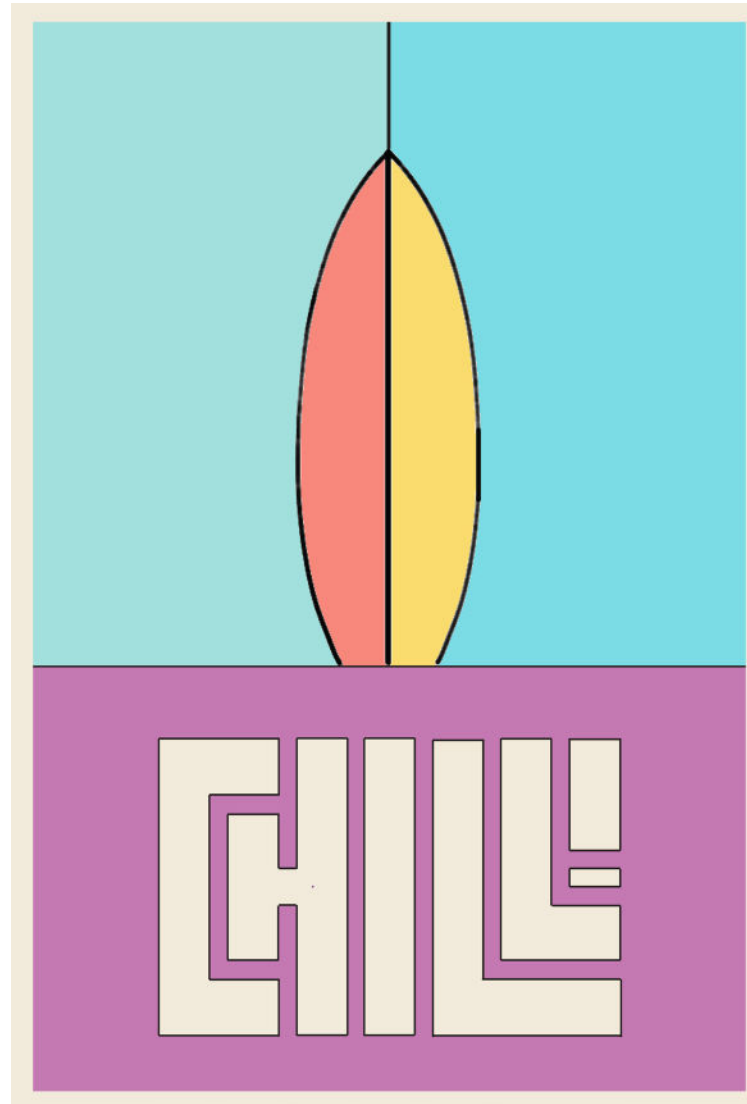

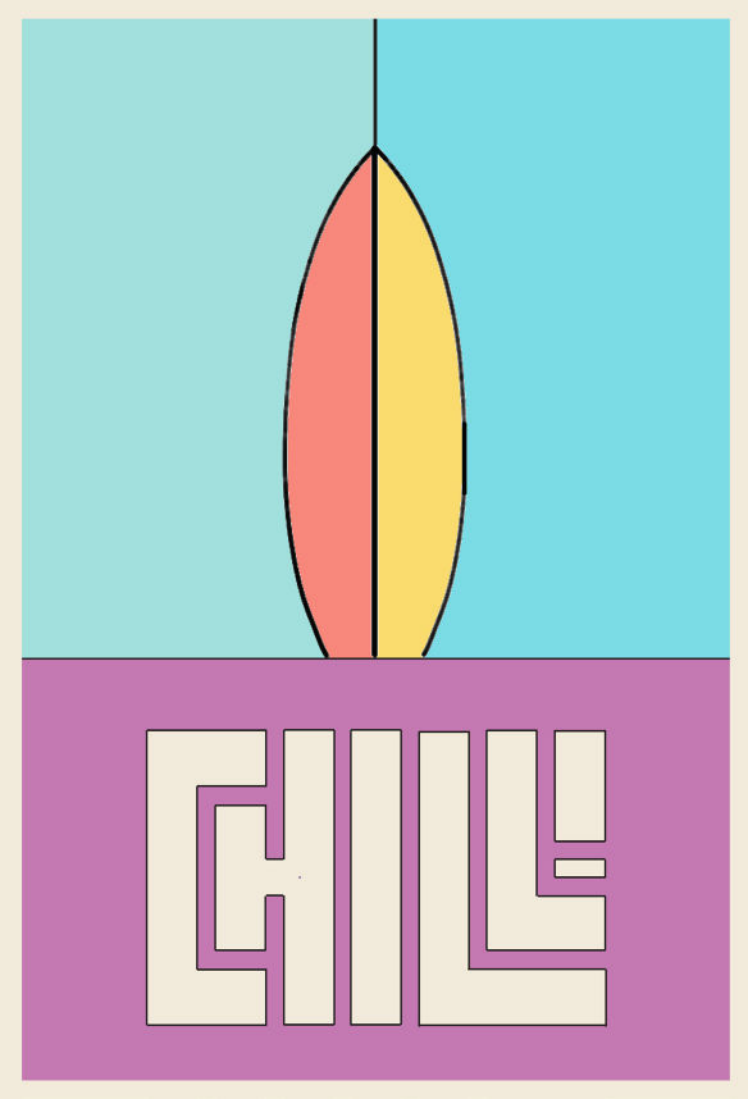

Measurements give room for error.

	Color A	Fat Quarter
	Color B	Fat Quarter

	Color D	Fat Eighths
	Color E	Fat Quarter
	Color F	Fat Quarter
	Binding	1/4 of a yard
	Backing	3/4 of a yard

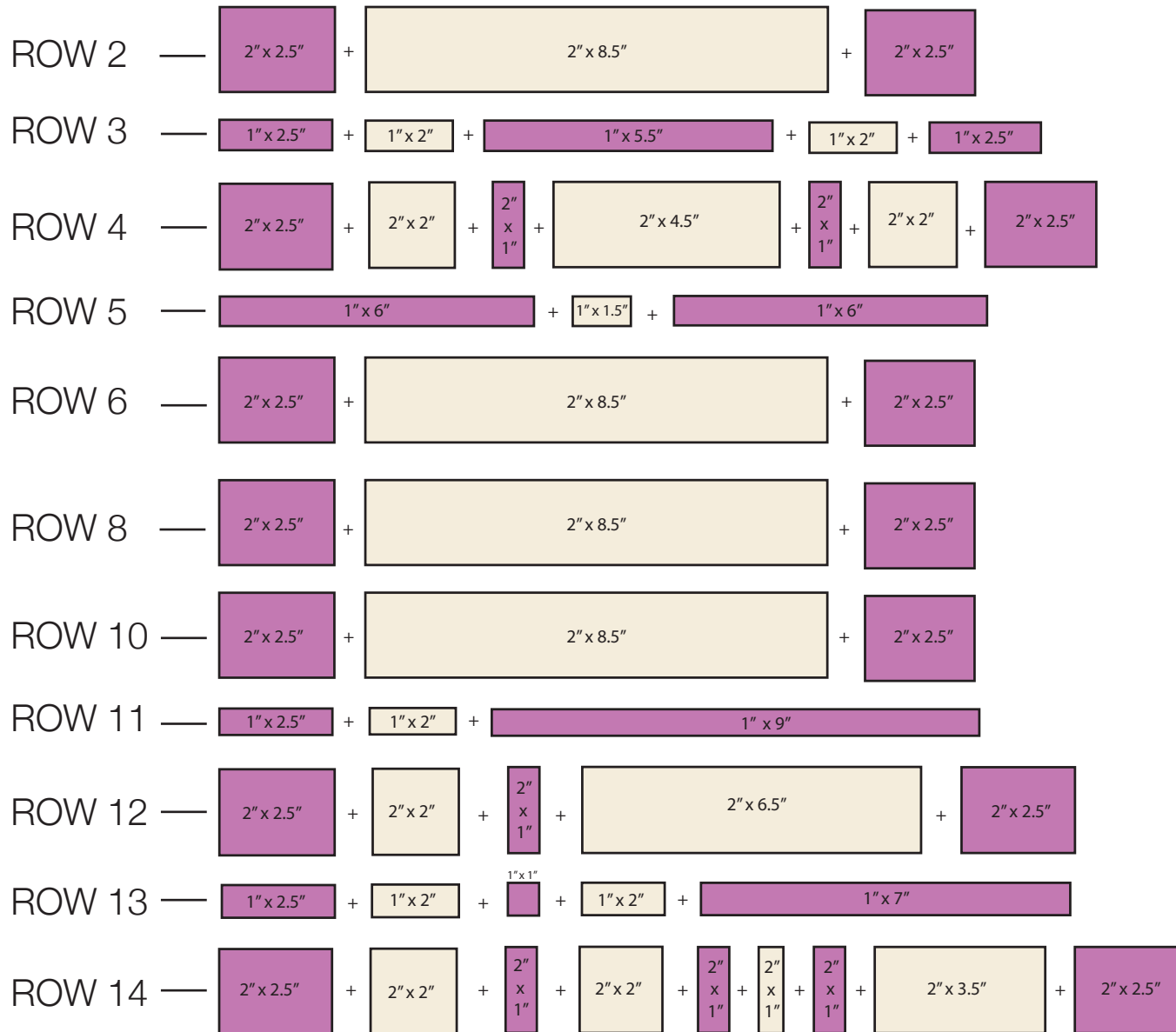

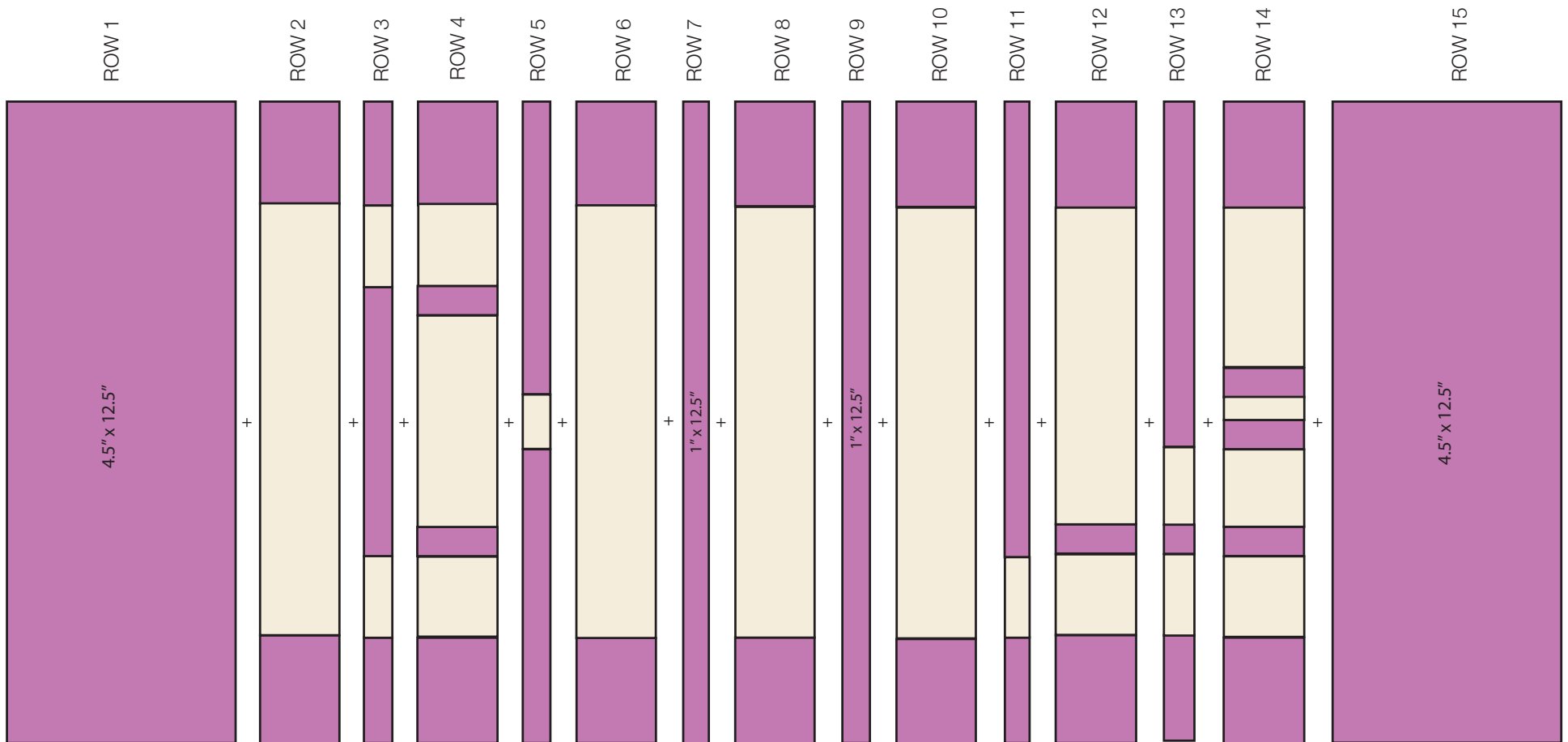
# Sewing Instructions - Chill Block

Let's start with sewing the rows together to create your "Chill Block". Sew pieces together as indicated below to create your rows.

Time to complete the "Chill Block". Sew rows together as indicated below.



# Printing Instructions

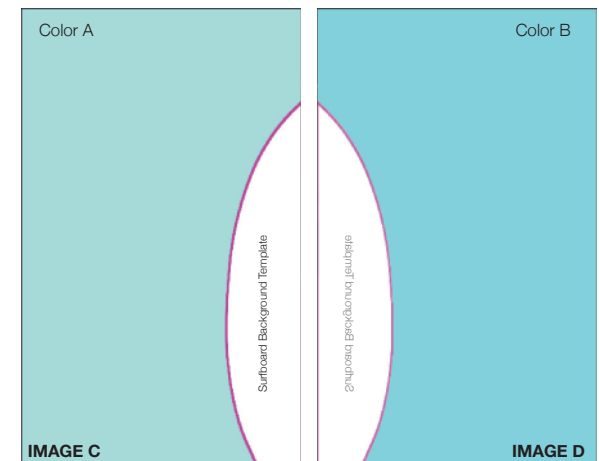
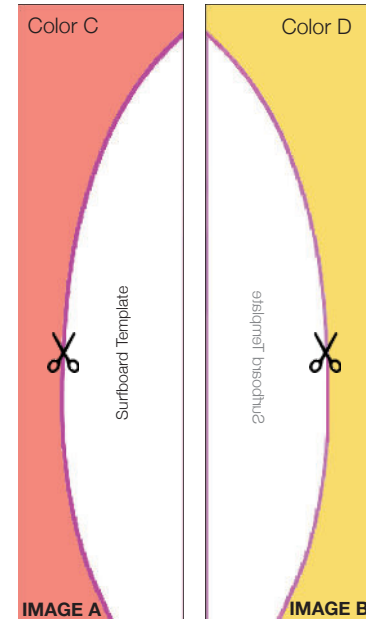
Before we tackle some curves, print out 1 copy of Appendix A, B, C, & D at 100% scale. Cut out images (where the scissors are placed). Tape “Surfboard Template A” and “Surfboard Template B” together. Then tape “Surfboard Background Template A” and “Surfboard Template B” together. When taping pieces, match the blue lines together. Once assembled, this will be your surfboard templates.

# Sewing Instructions - Surfboard Block

Now let's tackle some curves and sew the “Surfboard Block”. Take Color C and place the surfboard template at the bottom right corner as shown in Image A and cut. Now take Color D, flip the surfboard template and line it at the bottom left corner as shown in Image B and cut. Keep the surfboard fabric and discard of excess fabric.

Let's repeat this process for the surfboard background. Take Color A and place the surfboard background template at the bottom right corner as shown in Image C and cut. Now take Color B, flip the surfboard background template and line it at the bottom left corner as shown in Image D and cut. Keep the background and discard of surfboard fabric.

Sewing time. If you're not comfortable sewing curves, I highly recommend looking up a youtube tutorial. It may be easier to





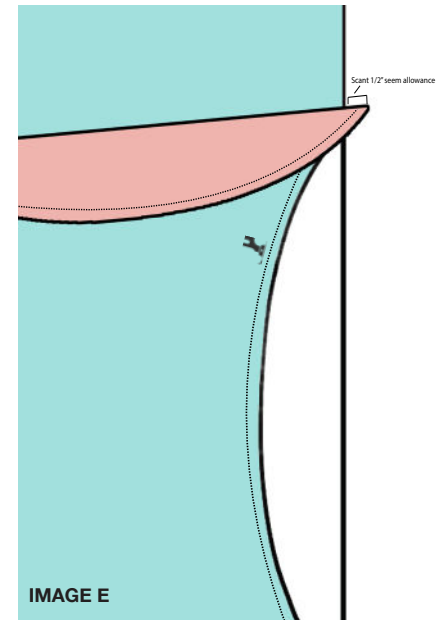
## Sewing Instructions - Surfboard Block continued

follow a video tutorial rather than reading my instructions and vague visuals.

Take fabric A and fabric C. Place right sides together starting at the tip of the surfboard with a scant 1/2" seam allowance. See Image E. Slowly sew your fabrics together with a 1/4" seam allowance, matching up the edges as you go. Continue down the curve until you are finished.

Repeat with fabric B and fabric D.

Once both blocks are completed, square up and trim your block down, then sew blocks together to complete your surfboard block.



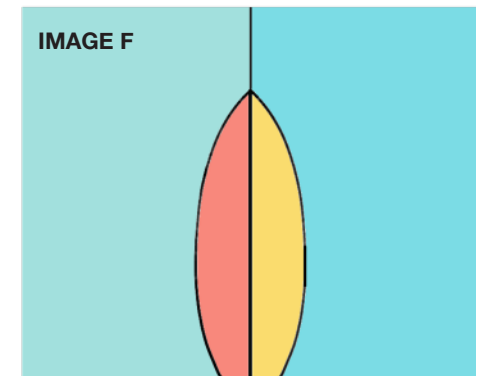
## Complete your Quilt Top

Time to complete your quilt top. Sew your surfboard block and chill block together as indicated in Image F.

## Finishing your Quilt

"Sandwich" time as I like to call it or basting for everyone else. Baste your quilt with your preferred method.

Once basted, time to quilt. I encourage you to have so much fun with this part. Think of waves, sand, clouds, stars, etc. The possibilities are always endless.



# Finishing your Quilt Continued

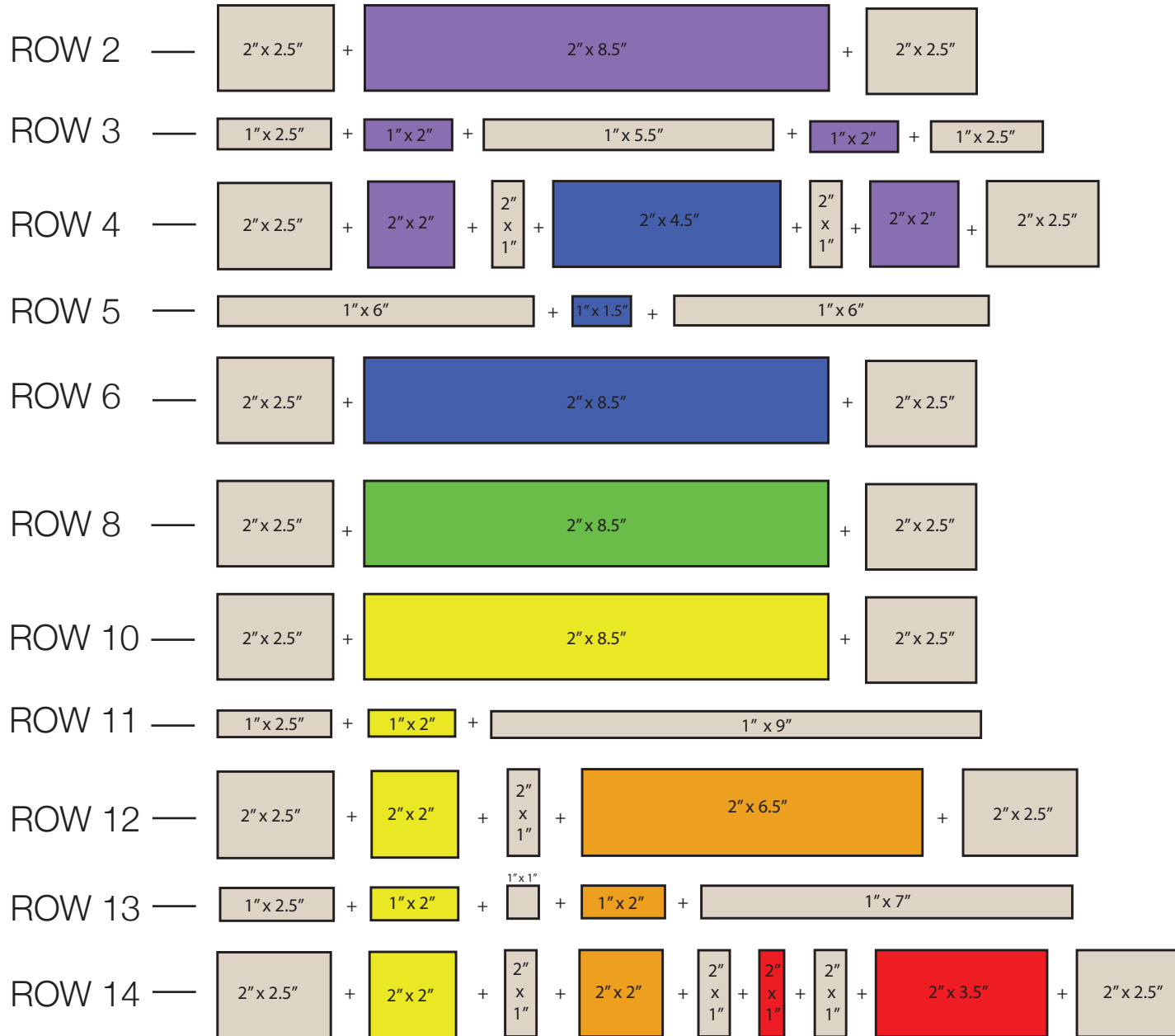
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Once you have completed quilting, square up and trim the edges and bind your quilt. Then TADA! Your Chill, Quilt is finished.

Now hang it up and admire your work. I hope it always reminds you to chill, especially during the rough days.

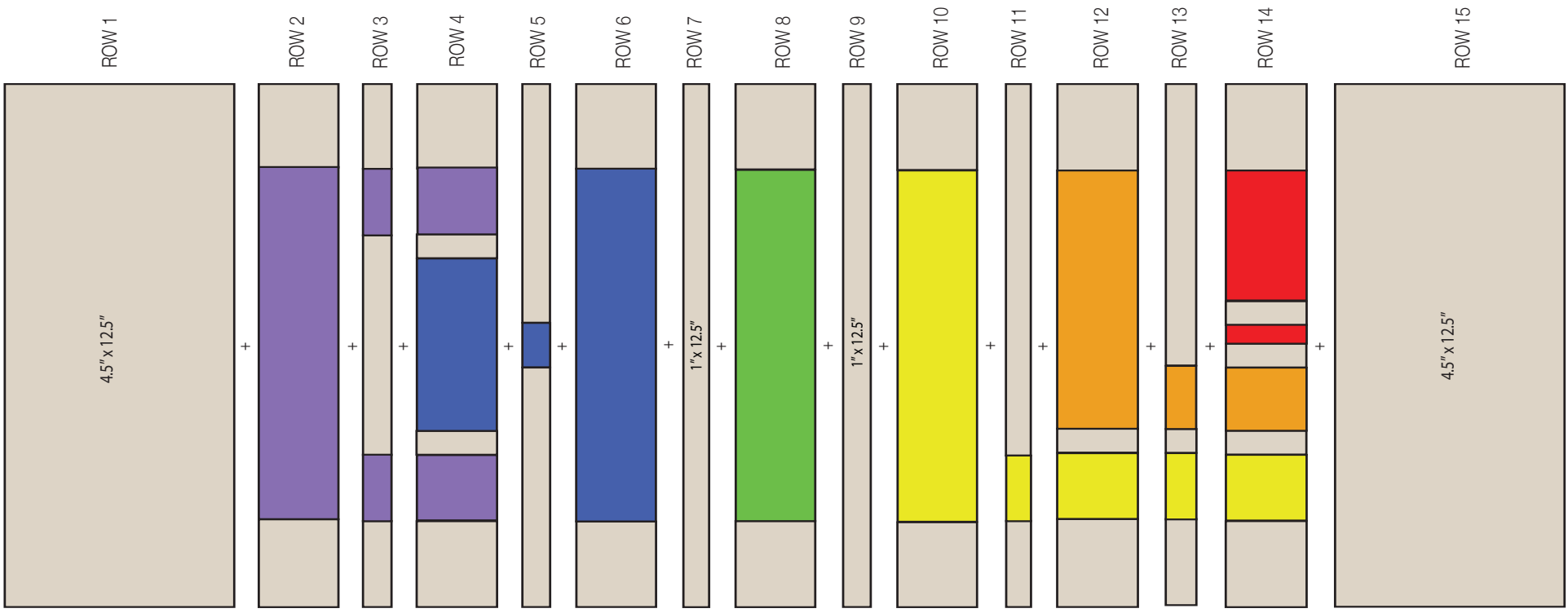


# Bonus Chill Block Layout

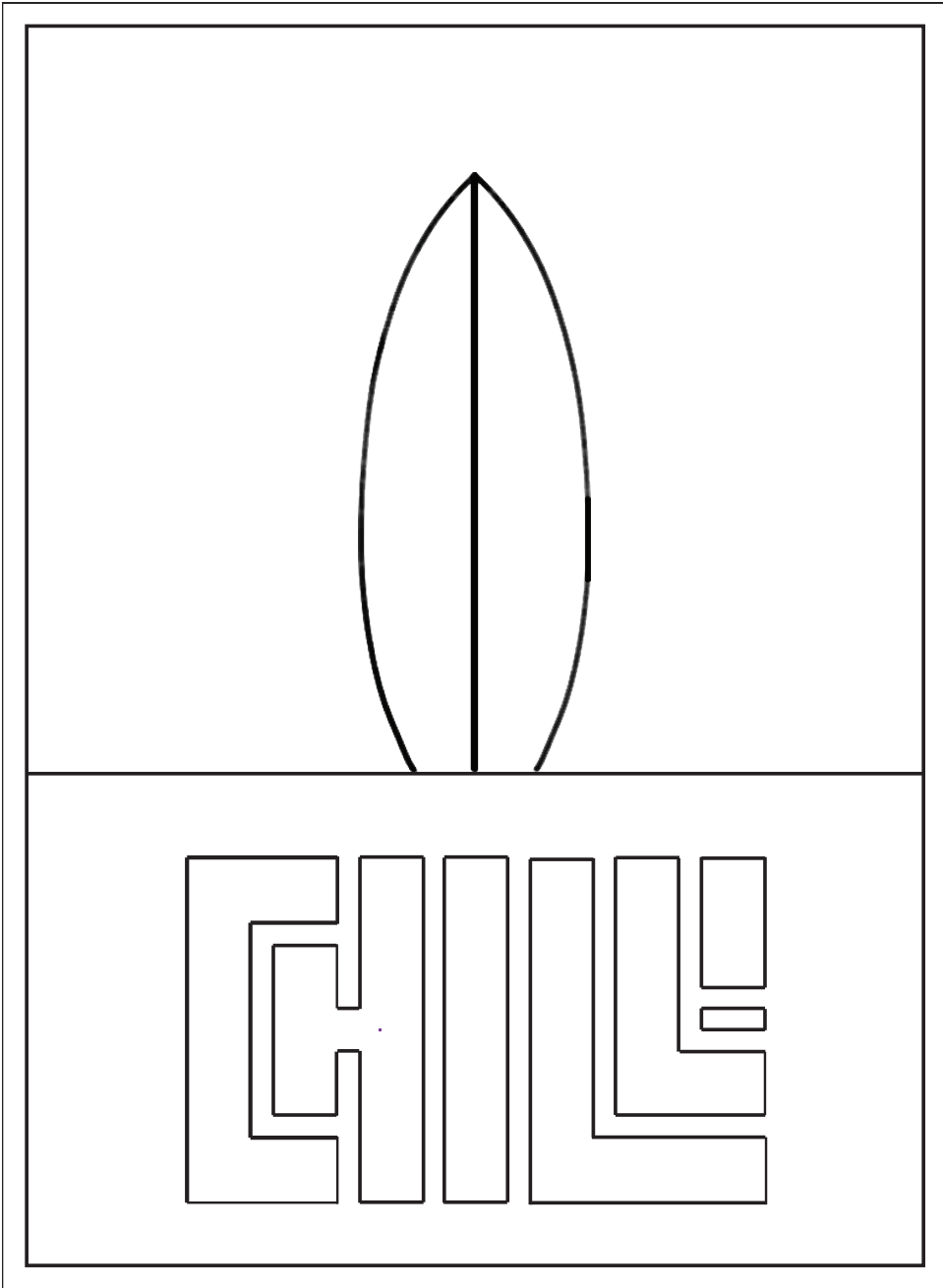
